At its hearing on Monday, June 21, 1976 the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against your

'You are hereby charged with possessing unauthorized aids in the form of handwritten sheets of paper during the final examination in ECO A01Y held on April 28, 1976, such act being an academic offence under Sections E 1 (a) (i) and G 11 of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour, as affirmed by Scarborough College Council action of March 31, 1976.'

In accordance with Section 65 of the Rules of Procedure of the University of Toronto Disciplinary Structure, I as writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal with respect to this charge.

The jury found you to be guilty of the charge. The determination of the jury on the question of sanction was as follows:

The mark of 0 should be assigned in the final examination and that a notation of the offence should be placed on your academic transcript until July 1, 1978. You should also be suspended for one year. This suspension will run concurrent with any academic suspension which may be imposed on you by Scarborough College.
