At its hearing on Wednesday, August 9, 1978 the Senior Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

that in March, 1978 you did, with intent to deceive, submit a paper entitled "The Bay of Pigs Decision: A Result of Groupthink?" for credit in Political Science B42Y (American foreign policy) in which you represented as your own ideas and the expression of ideas of others contrary to Section E.1(a)(ii) of the Priversity of Toronto Code of Behaviour.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge. The jury found you to be guilty of the charge and imposed the following sanction under Section F of the Code of Behaviour:

Sanction F.2(a)(iii) - failure (i.e. zero) in POLB42Y.

The jury felt that in keeping with its previous decision that a degree of deception had occurred you should receive a failure for POLB42Y.

Finally in accordance with Rule 65 I enclose extracts from the Enactment and Rules of Procedure regarding rights of appeal and the time limit in which the appeal must be filed.
