## PERSONAL AND CONFIDENTIAL

Dear Mr. L

At its hearing on Thursday, January 11, 1979 the local branch of the trial division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you: that in the autumn term of 1978, as a student at Erindale College in ENG 108Y, you did, with intent to deceive, submit work which you represented as your own but which was partially or completely the work of another, contrary to section El(a)(ii) of the Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge. The jury imposed the following sanction for the academic offence to which you pleaded quilty:

- 1) that you be officially censured; and
- 2) that the censure be recorded on your academic record until the end of your third year of undergraduate study at the University of Toronto.

The jury gave the following reasons for imposing this sanction:

We believe that the sanction for a second offence should be more severe than that already imposed for your first offence. We believe that an official record of this offence will reinforce throughout your undergraduate career your already acknowledged regret for the incident. We do not believe that a suspension under these circumstances would serve any constructive purpose. Further, we do not believe that your honest work, and your promise, should suffer.

In accordance with #65 of the Rules of Procedurc, I cnclose informa tion regarding rights of appeal and the time limit within which an appeal must be filed. In particular I would draw your attention to Sections 19-22 of the Enactment and #67-77 of the Rules of Procedure.
