Dear Mr. S.

At its hearing on Thursday, April 19, 1979 the local branch of the trial division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

that you resubmitted the paper written for the CHM 240Y Test held on December 15, 1978 with a number of additions, eliminations and alterations requesting reconsideration of questions 2, 3c, 4 and 5, and did represent this as your own work contrary to Sections E.1 (a)(i) and (ii) and Sections G.6 (a)(i) through (v), (b) and 7 of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour (Revised and Approved).

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this offence to which you pleaded guilty:

that you receive a failure (i.e. a mark of zero) in CHM 240Y.

The jury gave the following reasons for imposing this sanction:

'We feel that the lesser sanctions are too lenient given the nature of the offence, and that this particular sanction most closely corresponds with the severity of the crime, and will according to our understanding permit the accused to make some form of restitution to his career in the future.' In accordance with #65 of the Rules of Procedure, I enclose information regarding rights of appeal and the time limit within which an appeal must be filed. In particular I would draw your attention to Sections 19-22 of the Enactment and #67-77 of the Rules of Procedure.
