At its hearing on Wednesday, June 13, 1979 the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

that in the Final Faculty Examination in Zoology 250Y held on 26th April 1979, you were found to have a page of notes in your hand and were observed using these notes contrary to Section E.1(a)(i) and Sections G.6(a)(i) and G.7 of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this offence to which you pleaded guilty:

'that you receive a mark of zero in the final examination of Zoology 250Y'.

The jury gave the following reasons for imposing this sanction:

- 1) the total course grade is made up of various components;
- the offence was committed in only one component of evaluation;
- 3) the low mark inevitably obtained in the course will be in keeping with the offence, the guilty plea and the remorse exhibited.

In accordance with #65 of the Rules of Procedure, I enclose information regarding rights of appeal and the time limit within which an appeal must be filed. In particular I would draw your attention to Sections 19-22 of the Enactment and #67-77 of the Rules of Procedure.
