At its hearing on Tuesday, June 19, 1979, the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

that in the final faculty examination in PHY 110Y held on April 27, 1979, a small piece of paper, which had apparently been passed to you by the student sitting next to you, was found rolled up inside your hand. This is contrary to Section E.1(a)(i) and Sections G.1 and C.6(a)(i), (b) and C.7 of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour (Revised and Approved).

I am writing to advise you formally of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to this charge. The jury found you to be guilty of the charge under Section E.l(a)(i) and imposed the following sanctions under Section F of the Code of Behaviour.

Sanction F.1(d) - failure (i.e. zero) in PHY 110Y Sanction F.1(f) - suspension from the University for twelve months dating from June, 1979.

In accordance with Section G.4 the jury ordered that this sanction should be recorded on your academic record for a period of two years.

The jury gave as their reasons for these sanctions their opinion that cheating is the worst offence which a student can commit in the context of the University.

In accordance with Rule 65 I enclose extracts from the Enactment and Rules of Procedure regarding rights of appeal and the time limit in which the appeal must be filed.
