At its hearing on Monday, August 13, 1979 the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you -

that in Statistics 222Y you submitted under your own name Term Tests 2, 3 and 4 of another student whose name had been erased. In its place you had inserted your own name. This is contrary to Section E.1(a)(ii) and G.1, G.6(a)(i)(b), G.7 of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour (Revised and Approved).

I am writing to formally advise you of the decision of the Tribunal with respect to the charge. The jury found you guilty of the charge and imposed the following sanctions:

- 1) that you receive a mark of zero in STA 222Y;
- 2) that you be suspended for twelve months, this suspension for academic misconduct to be consecutive to the academic suspension you have received from the Faculty of Arts and Science. The cumulative effect of the academic suspension of one year and the suspension for academic misconduct of one year is to deny you further registration at the University of Toronto until the 1981 summer session;
- 3) that the twelve month suspension for academic misconduct be formally recorded on your academic record until the 1981 summer session.

The jury gave reasons for imposing these sanctions. In its opinion the sanctions requested by the Associate Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Science were entirely reasonable in light of the offences

committed and in view of the need for a deterrent to other students.

In accordance with \$65 of the Rules of Procedure I enclose information regarding the rights of appeal and the time limit in which the appeal must be filed. In particular I would draw your attention to Sections 19-22 of the Enactment and \$67-77 of the Rules of Procedure.
