Dear Mr. M.

At its hearing on Thursday, July 10, 1980, the Local Branch of the Trial Division of the University Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

... that in the Zoology 250Y examination held in Varsity Arena South on the morning of Tuesday 6 May 1980 you were found with a closely-written set of notes which you attempted to conceal. This is contrary to Section E.1(a) (i) and G.1, G.6(a)(i) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour (Revised and Approved).

I am writing to advise you formally of the decision of the Tribunal. After you had pleaded guilty-to the charge, the jury ordered that the following sanctions be imposed:

- that ZOO 250Y be recorded on your transcript with a mark of zero;
- 2) that you be suspended from attendance at the University for the fall term of the 1980/81 winter session;
- 3) that a notation of these sanctions be recorded on your academic record until January 1, 1982.

The jury assigned these sanctions 'in the interest of rehabilitation as well as retribution and in view of (Mr. $M_*/_5$) forthrightness in confessing his culpability.'

In accordance with #65 of the Rules of Procedure, I am forwarding to you and to Associate Dean J.R. Webster information regarding appeal rights and procedures. A Notice of Appeal would have to be filed with the Secretariat on or before July 24, 1980.
