At its hearing on November 8, 1982 the Tribunal considered the following charge against you:

That on Tuesday, April 20, 1982 you did knowingly use or possess unauthorized aids in the final examination in Statistics 242Y, contrary to Section E.l(a)(i) of the University of Toronto Code of Behaviour on Academic Matters.

The Tribunal found you guilty of the charge and imposed the following sanction:

• suspension from the University of Toronto for one year, the suspension to run from the beginning of May, 1983 to the end of April, 1984.

In giving reasons for this sanction the jury stated that this was a serious offence and that a period of suspension was necessary to protect the integrity of the University degree and to serve as a deterrent to other students. The jury concurred with counsel for the University that the period of suspension ought to start upon expiration of the one year academic suspension that you are currently serving.

I am forwarding to you and the University Discipline Counsel information regarding rights of appeal. The deadline for filing an appeal is November 30, 1982.
